EACH HUNTER IS RESPONSIBLE FOR KNOWING INFORMATION, PROCEDURES, AND REGULATIONS CONTAINED IN THE ANNUAL HUNTING FACT SHEET, AND EACH HUNTER IS REQUIRED TO READ AND COMPREHEND THE ENTIRE DOCUMENT, NOT JUST HUNT NUMBERS, AS A CONTRIBUTION TO THE FUTURE OF HUNTING ON FT HUACHUCA.

SPECIFIC HUNT NUMBERS AND TAG INFORMATION BECOME OBSOLETE AS THE TAGS ARE ISSUED. A NEW FACT SHEET WITH CURRENT INFORMATION WILL BE AVAILABLE BY EARLY MAY EACH YEAR.

****2010 CHANGES & ADVISORIES****

- * This document finalizes winter and spring hunt information for Ft Huachuca.
- * **Current Application Mailing Address:** The Arizona Game and Fish Department (AGFD) changed its mail address for hunt draw applications over a year ago to Arizona Game and Fish Department, P.O. Box 74020, Phoenix AZ, 85087-1052. Be sure to use the new green-striped envelopes with the updated address (NOT with the red stripe).
- * **New muzzleloader deer hunt:** There is a new muzzleloader hunt for any antlered deer in November.
- * **Javelina hunt control:** If javelina harvest during archery and gun hunts, especially of females, is concentrated in a game management area, that area may be closed for that hunt. For fairness of hunter opportunity, archery and gun hunts will have independent limits; archery harvest will not affect the gun hunt.
- * **Game camera use on Post:** Automatic, remote cameras deployed on Fort Huachuca for any purpose other than military, security or law enforcement requirements should be clearly labeled on the outside with a name and contact information. Visible identification is to minimize probability that private property will be unnecessarily disturbed or removed.
- * **Legalities of Picking Up Wildlife Parts:** Contact the AGFD (or if on Ft Huachuca, the Conservation Management Branch at 520-533-7083) prior to picking up vertebrate wildlife parts found afield (other than shed antlers). Arizona law requires evidence of legality when possessing or transporting wildlife carcasses or their parts. Furthermore, collecting ANY natural resource on the fort is authorized ONLY by written permission. A Post hunting permit authorizes possession of legally taken wildlife. Other collecting requires specific written permit.
- * **Firearms and ammunition transport in vehicles:** Mandatory firearms registration on Post is done at a temporary site away from the Main Gate Visitor Center as of May. Call ahead to 520-533-1840 or 3-6350 for the current location and open hours on Monday-Friday only. See section II.E., p.3.
- * Blaze orange is the standardized, required color of the upper garment and hat that ALL OUTDOOR RECREATIONAL USERS of Post training lands must wear during deer and javelina rifle big game seasons. Quail, squirrel and cotton tail rabbit hunters also must wear blaze orange when hunting. (See section II.L, near top of p.4).

I. WHO CAN HUNT ON POST?

A. All active and retired military personnel (worldwide), their spouses, and legal dependents 10 years old or older. Arizona requires a 30-day residence for military personnel before an Arizona Hunting License may be purchased.

B. Full-time Civil Service and Non-appropriated Fund employees of Ft Huachuca, their spouse and legal dependents 10 years old or older. Proof of civilian status requires showing a Ft Huachuca Identification Card. Having a Ft Huachuca permit from a previous year is not sufficient proof of eligibility.

C. A valid Arizona licensed hunter and Ft Huachuca permit holder who is 21 years or older may sponsor 2 guest hunters for a 72 hour period. A sponsor is authorized 4 guest hunts per year. Sponsors are required to sign a statement provided by the Sportsman Center guaranteeing their guest hunter's competence with hunter safety, firearms used on the hunt, and that each guest is in compliance with Arizona and Ft Huachuca Hunting Regulations. A guest hunter is authorized to hunt only upland game birds, rabbit, and coyote. **No one** who is eligible to hunt on Ft Huachuca under paragraph I. A or B of the Ft Huachuca hunting fact sheet is authorized to hunt as a guest.

1. A guest hunter is required to sign a statement of liability provided by the Sportsman Center in order to receive a guest hunter permit.
 2. Guest hunter permit fee is \$5.00 per year.
 3. Guest hunters must register their firearm(s) through the Military Police Weapons Registration section (533-1840 or 6350), in accordance with FH Reg 190-14. See section II.E.
 4. A guest hunter must remain within visual and voice range of the sponsor at all times while hunting.
 5. A guest hunter may hunt with more than one sponsor, but may not exceed three hunts for the year.
- All guest hunter requirements apply for each sponsor.

II. AS A HUNTER, WHAT RULES DO I NEED TO KNOW TO HUNT ON POST?

* All Post hunters are expected to review p. 92 of the "2010-2011 Arizona Hunting Regulations" regarding **jaguar** identification (See www.azgfd.com). Rifle hunters, especially predator hunters, should be aware that jaguar might be in the area and are fully protected by state and federal law.

A. Possess all licenses, stamps and tags required by AGFD for the game hunted.

B. A Post hunting permit is required of **all** Post hunters.

1. Post hunting permits are sold only at the Post Sportsman Center, 520-533-7085, which is open Wednesday through Sunday (i.e. they are **not** available Mondays, Tuesdays or holidays).
2. Proof of completion of a bonafide **hunter education course** is required to obtain a Ft Huachuca hunting permit.
 - a. Acceptable courses include AGFD Hunter Education courses, any state-sponsored hunter education course (i.e. a card or certificate of completion from the issuing state, **NOT** just a license from a state requiring hunter education), an NRA Hunter Safety Course, or the German Hunting Course. The only exception to this requirement is for a guest hunter.

b. If you have any doubts about your hunter education card, check with the Sportsman Center well before you plan to purchase your Post hunting permit. Each year a few hunters fail to do this and end up not being authorized to use their deer tag (i.e. their AZ Hunt Permit-tag for a Ft Huachuca Deer Hunt) at all.

c. You may register for an AGFD Basic Hunter Education Course at the Sportsman Center if a course is scheduled. Online Field Days may be scheduled to allow people who successfully completed the AGFD Online portion to complete the course and be certified for hunter education.

d. Sale of Arizona hunting & fishing licenses for 2010 at the Sportsman Center may stop about 24 December 2010 for holidays; thus, if you (or someone you know) want to hunt or fish from 24 December to 1 January, be sure to buy a license before 24 December 2010.

3. The Sportsman Center also has maps of Post Game Management Areas.

C. Abide strictly by all hunting regulations published yearly by the Arizona Game and Fish Department.

D. Be familiar with and abide by all Ft Huachuca hunting regulations (FH Supplement 1 to AR 200-3). Ft Huachuca Game Management Area Maps (sheet 1--Main Post, 2--East Range, and 3--Archery Areas) also contain information hunters must follow.

E. All firearms on Post must be registered at the Military Police Vehicle and Weapons Registration office in accordance with FH Reg 190-14. This service is available Monday-Friday only. Call ahead to 520-533-1840 or 6350 for open hours (currently 0700-1530) and current location. (As of the date of this fact sheet, registration is done at a temporary site away from the Main Gate Visitor Center.)

F. Anyone entering Ft Huachuca will be required to show identification at the gate before being allowed access to post. Vehicle operators must have vehicle registration and proof of insurance.

G. Eligible dependents **under 16** years of age must be accompanied by a properly licensed adult when hunting. Properly licensed means the **accompanying adult** must have an Arizona Hunting License and a Post Hunting Permit.

H. All weapons transported in any type of motorized vehicle on post will be in a completely unloaded condition. Firearms must be out of easy reach of people, and ammunition must be separated from firearms.

1. Loaded weapons (rounds in barrel **OR** an attached magazine) are unlawful in a vehicle on post.

2. Hunters using muzzleloading or cap and ball type blackpowder firearms must remove the cap from a percussion weapon, or the powder from the pan of a flintlock. Muzzleloading firearms allowed for hunting by AGFD are authorized on Post, e.g. traditional or modern in-line ignitions, shooting sabot, conical or ball projectiles.

3. Bow hunters must transport arrows in a quiver.

4. These restrictions also apply when a hunter walks across a Post safety zone (No Hunting area).

I. **Target practice and sighting in are not authorized away from an established shooting range.**

1. Any shot fired (except as noted below) in a Game Management Area must be in an attempt to take legal game by a legally licensed and signed-out hunter.

2. A hunter using a muzzleloading type weapon may, at the end of the hunt, discharge the weapon in a safe manner, rather than having to pull the charge or charges.

J. Hunting and/or shooting within a radius of 200 yards with a bow and arrow or 1/4 mile with a rifle, shotgun or pistol near the following locations, people, or situations is prohibited:

1. Any building, tent, maneuver or bivouac area when in use.

2. Any test site (i.e. Scott Peak, Aerostat, Black Tower/UAS area, etc.).

3. Libby Army Airfield.
4. Garden Canyon and Huachuca Canyon picnic areas.
5. Ammunition Storage Areas.
6. Recreation and picnic areas or other places when non-hunting public, including horseback riders, or Post personnel are congregating.
7. Any location or situation in which a prudent person would perceive danger to life or property is not authorized for hunting. No hunting is allowed within 100 yards of any major road or a road likely to have regular traffic.

K. All hunters must sign out each time they go hunting. During firearms hunts for deer and javelina, all hunters must also sign in upon returning from hunting (See sections III and IV for required procedures).

L. All authorized firearms hunting areas on Ft Huachuca are off limits for any other recreational use during firearms deer and javelina seasons. The only exception is when the other users meet the blaze orange clothing requirement (see Paragraph L.1. below) for hunters during the same period (Nov 13-29 & 11-30 Dec 2010; Feb 18-24, 2011).

1. During firearms deer and javelina seasons, blaze orange clothing is required apparel for entering any authorized firearms hunting area on Ft Huachuca. Minimum requirement is a blaze orange hat and a jacket or vest. A camouflage version that is solid blaze orange on at least 50% of the surface area is authorized.

2. Quail, squirrel and cottontail rabbit hunters and non-hunting members of their group must also wear the blaze orange clothing when hunting. Note that this does not apply to any other recreational users at this time.

M. ALL deer, lion, bear, javelina and turkey harvested on Post must be checked in at the Sportsman Center on the DAY KILLED. After duty hours, a hunter must weigh an animal on scales located under the ramada behind (east of) the Sportsman Center on Garden Canyon Rd (Bldg 15423). At this big game check station, fill in a self-check harvest information card with a telephone number or electronic mail address. Keep the lower jaw or head for at least 1 duty day in case a biologist requests to examine it. **The AGFD also requires hunters to report archery deer harvest and to report and physically present to AGFD their harvested bear and/or lion (new this year); see AGFD regulations.**

N. Trapping on Post is not authorized for private individuals.

O. There are specific areas for **Archery-Only hunting** on post. The map of these areas (Sheet 3) lists special rules hunters must follow when using them.

P. All **waterfowl** hunting must be conducted with steel shot.

Q. Legal shooting times are during daylight hours (except for migratory bird hunts, which run according to federal regulations).

R. Vehicles, including motorcycles, Off Road Vehicles, and All Terrain Vehicles are **NOT** authorized to travel off road or cross-country. **Firebreaks and dirt roads maintained for vehicle access** may be used for access to Game Management Areas by properly signed-out hunters. **CHAMP** hunters may hunt and shoot from a vehicle, but the weapon may **not** be loaded (or discharged) while the vehicle is in motion.

S. A hunter may not possess or transport any alcoholic beverage while hunting.

T. Each hunter is responsible for informing someone other than hunt control where they will be hunting and at what time they should be considered late in returning. Each hunter must be sure the informed person knows the license plate number and description of the vehicle used while hunting. This informed person will contact the Military Police Desk (520-533-3000 or 533-2181), and provide this information if the hunter fails to return as scheduled.

U. Military training and firing schedules have priority over all hunts. Therefore, some or all Game Management Areas may be closed to hunting on any specific day.

1. Hunting may be closed with little or no notice due to changes in training requirements.
2. If hunt control personnel advise you that there is a **caution** in your chosen area, be extra alert and careful.
 - a. The caution means there either is training or non-hunting recreational activities scheduled to occur in that area.
 - b. If upon reaching the assigned area, you feel there are too many other people in the area, or you are hunting in an area that may cause adverse comments, please leave and sign-out for a different area.

V. Failure to abide by Post and/or state hunting regulations, laws, rules, or command directives may result in loss of Post and state hunting privileges, as well as applicable state and Federal criminal sanctions.

III. HOW DO I SIGN-OUT DURING PERIODS OF GENERAL WEAPONS DEER (i.e. FIREARMS) HUNTS IN NOVEMBER AND DECEMBER?

A. **ALL** hunters must sign-out and sign-in at the Sportsman Center on Garden Canyon Road (Bldg 15423) in person or using **telephone no. 520-533-7085 only**. (See III.F. and III.G.) For javelina hunting, see IV. A and F.

B. **Other hunters** may sign-out during these big game hunts. However, the first hour of hunter sign-out each day is reserved for Hunt Permit-tag holding hunters. **These other hunters are limited to using shotguns with no. 4 or smaller lead shot, or no. 1 or smaller steel shot.**

C. Hunting area reservations are made on a 1st-Come, 1st-Serve **daily** basis. No prior day sign-out is allowed. Areas G-M (West Range) may be open for sign-out the first 3 days of the Nov and/or Dec deer hunts **ONLY** for hunters with a tag that allows mule deer as legal game.

D. Hunter sign-out will begin **before or at** 0500 for November hunts, and 0530 for December hunts; approximately 1.5 hours prior to first shooting light.

E. **Hunters must sign-in by 1900 hours.**

1. This can be done in person or by telephone.
2. **Not signing-in can lead to loss of hunting privileges.**
3. Members of a hunting party may have one group member sign everyone in (and are encouraged to do so), but each individual hunter is ultimately responsible for ensuring you have been signed-in, and should not merely assume you have been.

F. The **first time** a hunter signs-out for a November or December deer hunt it **must be done in person, and each member of the party must be wearing the required blaze orange clothing during sign-out.** After you have signed-out the first time in person, you may sign-out and in by telephone at **520-533-7085**.

G. **Telephone sign-out** will begin by 0530 for November and 0600 for December hunts. If telephones are not operational, hunters must sign-out and sign-in, in person.

H. When a waiting line has formed during sign-out, **each** hunter must be present physically and standing in the line.

I. Limited Weapons Areas: Legal crossbows and legal archery gear are the only weapons allowed in most of these areas during these hunts (Note: crossbows are **not** legal during Archery-Only hunts).

1. Hunters holding a deer Permit-tag can hunt in Archery-Only areas during their hunt, and are **not** required to wear blaze orange clothing while in these areas.

2. Some special areas allow use of muzzleloading rifles and shotguns with slugs during general deer hunts. Hunters and other recreational users **are required** to wear blaze orange clothing in these areas during rifle deer and javelina hunts.

J. Any **harvested big game** must be brought and checked in at the game check station under the ramada by skeet ranges at the Sportsman Center **on the day it is taken**. (See section II.M). Arizona also requires harvest reporting and/or physical presentation of certain species; see AGFD Hunting Regulations for details.

K. All hunters must comply with II.V above.

IV. HOW DO I SIGN OUT DURING ALL OTHER HUNTING SEASONS?

A. Hunter sign-out for the General Weapons Javelina hunt in February is done through the MP Desk.

B. Mandatory hunter sign-out is conducted by the Military Police Operations Desk (telephone 520-533-3000 or 2181). MPs CONTROL HUNTER SIGN-OUT AS PART OF THEIR RESPONSIBILITY FOR SAFETY AND SECURITY ON POST, AS A SERVICE TO HUNTERS, TO PROVIDE SAFETY CLEARANCE AND TO CONTROL ACCESS INTO HUNTING AREAS. MPs ARE **NOT** RESPONSIBLE FOR KNOWING OR PROVIDING HUNTING REQUIREMENTS OR INFORMATION. EACH HUNTER IS ACCOUNTABLE FOR KNOWING SEASON DATES, WEAPONS RESTRICTIONS AND ALL OTHER HUNTING REGULATIONS ON POST AND IN ARIZONA.

1. Have your Post permit number available, and call 520-533-3000 or 2181.

2. Ask to sign out for hunting, and wait if asked.

3. Provide Post hunting permit numbers(s), area(s) desired, and game hunted, as it is requested.

4. Wait for the MP to check information and clear you.

5. If the MP says there is no Hunter Control Card on file under your Post permit number or name, you must go to the MP station in person, show your Post permit (or leave a copy), and sign out for your hunt.

C. Hunter sign-out is mandatory for each hunting trip. Re-signing in and out is required to change hunting areas.

D. Signing-in from hunting is not normally required during times the MP Desk conducts hunter control; however, checking of big game is still required (See section II.M).

1. The MP Desk **may** request hunters to sign-in at the end of hunting. If so, hunters should follow any such directive.

E. All hunters must comply with II.V above.

F. During small game, archery, predator, and some Hunt Permit-tag requiring hunts, **a hunter may sign out for up to 3 adjacent Game Management Areas**, if requested areas are not full or closed by firing or training. These 3 areas **must be adjacent to each other** in order to reduce problems the Military Police might have in emergency notifications, or in having to locate a hunter who did not return as scheduled.

G. Start: Hunter sign-out through the MP Desk starts at 0430 throughout most of the year, except 20 April through 31 May, when it starts 0400 to accommodate spring turkey hunting.

H. End: Hunters will not be permitted to sign out after 1730.

I. Hunters must be out of the field by 1.5 hours after sunset.

J. Hunters with a General Javelina Hunt Permit-tag who choose to hunt in Archery-Only areas with bow or crossbow during their hunt are **not** required to wear blaze orange while in these areas.

V. HOW DO I GET BIG GAME TAGS?

A. You may purchase a Nonpermit (or "over the counter") tag for mountain lion, Archery-Only deer, and fall bear hunting from any AGFD license dealer, including the Ft Huachuca Sportsman Center. You may purchase an Archery-Only deer Nonpermit tag and still apply for a Hunt Permit-tag-requiring deer hunt; however, you can fill only one of these deer tags. A 2010 Archery deer tag is invalid on 1 Jan 2011. You must use a 2011 Arizona hunting license number or an application for a 2011 hunting license, to apply for javelina, bear and turkey Hunt Permit-tags.

B. Drawing for Hunt Permit-tags (for rifle deer, spring and summer bear, javelina, and turkey hunts) for use on Ft Huachuca **cannot be applied for online or by telephone**, but can either be hand-delivered to an AGFD office or posted by US mail to AGFD at **P.O. Box 74020, Phoenix AZ, 85087-1052**. Be sure to use the new green-striped envelopes with the updated address (NOT with the red stripe). See printed AGFD "2010-11 Arizona Hunting and Trapping Regulations" or online at www.azgfd.gov.

C. Applications for deer hunts that require Hunt Permit-tags must reach AGFD by 1900 (MST), 8 June 2010. Postmarks do not count. If you are drawn, the Permit-tag will be mailed out from AGFD by 13 August. First-come, first-serve applications are accepted by AGFD starting 0800, Monday 2 August for any leftover permits not issued in the draw. Early applications arriving before 2 August will be returned. Leftover tags can be obtained **only** by US mail to AGFD at the address above until 9 August. Permits still available can be purchased in person at all AGFD offices starting 0800.

D. Archery-Only and General javelina, spring and summer bear, and turkey hunts also require Hunt Permit-tags. Applications for javelina, bear and turkey hunts on Ft Huachuca must reach AGFD by 1900 (MST), on a date in fall 2010, to be published by AGFD late this summer, in their 2011 Spring Hunt Draw Information. Application for a drawing or 1st-Come, 1st-Serve allocation is the same procedure as the draw for fall hunts. ***Remember, you must purchase a 2011 AZ license to apply for the spring draw.***

E. A Hunt Permit-tag will be mailed directly to each successful applicant. Hunters must sign their tag(s), a legal document, prior to hunting with it. General and muzzleloader deer hunters must sign-out in person at the Sportsman Center the first time they choose to hunt on their specific hunt. (See III.F).

F. Open hunting dates and hunt numbers for those hunts on Post requiring an AGFD Hunt Permit-tag are:

HUNTERS ARE REMINDED TO READ AND BE FAMILIAR WITH THIS ENTIRE FACT SHEET, NOT JUST HUNT NUMBERS. THIS WILL HELP DIRECTLY TO CONTINUE AVAILABILITY OF BIG GAME HUNTING ON POST, AND ITS COMPATIBILITY WITH OTHER ACTIVITIES.

There is no December Archery-Only hunting open on Ft Huachuca. To hunt deer on Post in December, you **must** possess a Permit-tag for General Deer Hunts No. 1902 or 1905.

* **NOTE:** If you receive ANY ARIZONA DEER HUNT PERMIT-TAG in the Drawing, you MAY NOT APPLY for a deer Hunt Permit-tag during the 1st-Come, 1st-Serve application period. If you were an unsuccessful applicant, or missed the Drawing for deer hunts, you may apply for remaining deer permits during the 1st-Come, 1st-Serve period BEGINNING 2 August 2010 (See section V. C.).
